Founded in 2008, Community Research is a national, capability-building NGO whose strategies are:

- Te Pono Me Te Tika Increased quality assurance and good-practice in community research
- Ngā Hononga Increased, stronger connections between researchers and the Tangata Whenua, community and voluntary sectors
- Ngā Mahi Rangahau Rautaki Strategic research of significance to the sector
- Kia Tū Tonu Te Whare The ongoing, sustainable operation of the organisation

Entity Structure

Community Research is a national membership organisation with members throughout Aotearoa New Zealand. It has a small, paid staff based in Wellington. Community Research operates on a Treaty of Waitangi basis. The Governance Group executes its business through a Tangata Tiriti caucus and a Tangata Whenua caucus.

Main Sources of Entity's Cash and Resources

The organisation's 2020/21 income combined government funding (42%), philanthropic support (55%), and Other Services and Membership (3%)

Main Methods Used by Entity to Raise Funds

Community Research raises funds through grant applications and applications for philanthropic donations. The organisation generated grants from two new Government agencies for the first time this year, and their support advances Community Research on its journey towards 'whole-of-Government' support.

Entity's Reliance on Volunteers and Donated Goods or Services

The 8 members of the Governance Group provide their services on a voluntary basis. As well as their governance role, they are each responsible for a particular portfolio relating to an aspect of the organisation. In addition, most of our webinar presenters volunteer their services or are only provided with koha. We also had a volunteer intern collating a collection of resources for us for 2 months.

Tangata Whenua, Community and Voluntary Sector Research Centre **Incorporated** For the year ended 30 June 2021

Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Revenue

Revenue is recognised when the following specifics have been met:

Donations, fundraising and other similar revenue

Donations and Fundraising are recognised when received.

Grant revenue is recognised when the conditions of the grant has been meet, any unfulfilled component is shown as a liability and recognised as Income when the conditions are met.

Revenue from Providing Goods and Services

Revenue is recognised in the period the goods and services have been provided.

Interest Revenue

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Tangata Whenua, Community and Voluntary Sector Research Centre Incorporated is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.

Report on the Performance Report

We have reviewed the accompanying performance report of Tangata Whenua, Community and Voluntary Sector Research Centre Incorporated on pages 3 to 14 which comprises the entity information, the statement of service performance, the statement of financial performance, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year ended 30 June 2021, the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2021, and the statement of accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Responsibility of the Governance Group Board for the Performance Report

The Governance Group are is responsible on behalf of the entity for

(c) for such internal control as the Governance Group determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the performance report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Assurance Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the performance report. We conducted our review of the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flows, statement of accounting policies and notes to the performance report in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (New Zealand) (ISRE (NZ)) 2400 (Revised), Review of Historical Financial Statements Performed by an Assurance Practitioner who is not the Auditor of the Entity, and the review of the entity information and statement of service performance in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised). Those standards require us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the performance report, taken as a whole, is not prepared in all material respects in accordance with the Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not-For-Profit). Those standards also require that we comply with ethical requirements.

A review of the performance report in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400(Revised) and ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised) is a limited assurance engagement. We will perform procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluate the evidence obtained. The procedures selected depend on our judgement, including the areas identified where a material misstatement is likely to arise and includes performing procedures to obtain evidence and evaluating whether the

reported outcomes and outputs, and quantification of the outputs to the extent practicable, are relevant, reliable, comparable and understandable.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) and ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on the performance report.

Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner we have no relationship with, or interests in, Tangata Whenua, Community and Voluntary Sector Research Centre Incorporated.

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that:
